Smell Gas? Leave Fast!

If you smell gas, leave fast! Natural gas from MLGW is stinky and smells like rotten eggs or sulfur. If you smell gas, there may be a leak. Take these precautions:



• Leave immediately! Abandon your house, building, vehicle, equipment, etc.

• Do not cause sparks by smoking, using matches, phones, lights, electricity, or flashlights.

• Go outside or to a neighbor's house to call MLGW's Emergency Hotline 901-528-4465 and 911.

• Do not start vehicles or equipment near a leak.

Natural gas leaks typically result from damaged underground gas pipelines or household or business gas appliances. Have your gas appliances, heater, and water heater checked by a professional every year to ensure they are safe and work correctly.
