MLGW Advances Renewable Energy with New Solar and Battery Storage Initiative

MLGW is strengthening its commitment to sustainable energy with the release of a Request for Proposal (RFP) to add 100 megawatts of solar generation alongside

80 megawatts of battery storage to its energy portfolio.

This initiative is designed to modernize MLGW's



infrastructure by reducing peak energy demand, improving grid stability, and further exploring costeffective renewable energy solutions. The planned project will include 50MW of battery storage with two- or four-hour capacity and an additional 30MW of storage at designated substations.

As part of its long-term commitment to a cleaner, more reliable power grid, MLGW aims to have the first phase of operations online by the third guarter of 2026.

Safe Digging Month

All year! April may be Safe Digging Month, but safe digging is an important practice for the entire year. Anytime you plan to dig, you must call 811 to have your underground utilities marked before you or your contractor can dig, construct, cross-bore



and more. It's the law. It's also free. If you're planting a garden, digging for fence posts, getting the driveway repaved, contracting for an addition, call 811 first. Always wait at least 72 hours or three business days for lines to be marked. Always call before digging. Make sure your contractors call, too. You don't want to go BOOM! Be safe!
